RULES

1. Entries for Sections A, B, C, D and E will only be accepted from members of The British Cactus and Succulent Society.
2. Entries for Sections F and G will only be accepted from competitors who are not members of The British Cactus and Succulent Society. Juniors are defined as competitors under 16 years of age.
3. All exhibitors in Sections F and G should complete the entry form on the back page and return it to the Show Secretary by Saturday 14 May 2005.
4. The Judges may, at their discretion, withhold any award in any Class where they consider the standard to be too low.
5. Judging and classification will be as laid down in the BCSS "Guide to Shows & Exhibitions, 9th Edition" published in 2003.
6. Objections must be made in writing to the Show Convener before 2.45 pm on the day of the Show.
7. In Section E, a Novice will be defined as any member of Ayr Branch who has never previously won a BCSS trophy (not including medals).
8. The size of the pot shall be taken as the inside diameter, measured at the top. For square pots, the size shall be taken as the length of one edge, measured on the inside at the top of the pot.
9. All entries must be staged by 11.00 am on the day of the Show. Exhibitors must refrain from staging once judging has commenced.
10. Plants exhibited must be the property of the exhibitor.
11. Exhibits must not be removed from the Show Hall before 4pm. All exhibits must be cleared from the Show Hall by 5.00 pm.
12. Exhibitors in Sections E, F and G may make only one entry in each class. Exhibitors in other Sections may make up to three entries in any one class.
13. Staging will be supervised by the Show Convener and Stewards who will have the right to move or alter any exhibit.
14. Exhibitors must report to the Show Convener Mr Alistair Hair who will provide them with their Exhibitor's Number and Staging cards.
15. Points system: 1st = 3 points 2nd = 2 points 3rd = 1 point.
16. Trophies may be engraved with the winners name at their own expense.
17. The Show Committee cannot accept liability for loss or damage to plants or other personal property or injury incurred by attending the Show, however incurred.
18. Entry in the Show constitutes acceptance of these rules.
