#### RULES

- Entries for Sections A,B,C,D and E will only be accepted from members of The British Cactus and Succulent Society.
- 2. The Judge may, at his/her discretion withhold any award in any Class where he considers the standard to be too low.
- 3. Judging and classification will be as laid down in the BCSS "Guide to Shows & Exhibitions 9th Edition published in 2003.
- 4. Objections must be made in writing to the Show Convener before 2.45pm on the day of the Show.
- 5. In Section E, a Novice will be defined as any member of Ayr Branch who has never previously won a BCSS trophy (not including medals).
- The size of the pot shall be taken as the inside diameter, measured at the top. For square pots, the size shall be taken as the length of one edge, measured on the inside at the top of the pot.
- 7. All entries must be staged by 11.00a.m. on the day of the Show. Exhibitors must refrain from staging once judging has commenced.
- 8. Plants exhibited must be the property of the exhibitor.
- 9. Exhibits must not be removed from the Show Hall before 4pm. All exhibits must be cleared from the Show Hall by 5.00pm.
- 10. Exhibitors in Sections E may make only one entry in each class.
- 11. Staging will be supervised by the Show Convneer and Stewards who will have the right to move or alter any exhibit.
- 12. Exhibitors must report to the Show Convener Mrs Mairi Frew who will provide them with their Exhibitors number and staging cards.
- 13. Points system 1st 3 points, 2nd 2 points, 3rd 1 point.
- 14. Trophies may be engraved with the winners name at their own expense.
- The Show Committee cannot accept liability for loss or damage to plants or other personal property or injury incurred by attending the show, however incurred.
- 16. Entry in the Show constitutes acceptance of these rules.
